SPECIAL SESSION – 7:30 p.m.

I. CALL TO ORDER AND ANNOUNCE A QUORUM PRESENT

Mayor Linda Inman called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. Town Council members present in person were Council Member Stojan Bacev, Council Member Jordan Woodard,

Mayor Pro-Tem Kelly Nelson, Council Member Victoria Mitchell and Council Member Jeff Doramus were physically present, being a quorum.

II. INVOCATION

Connie Sparks, Town Secretary, led the invocation.

III. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

IV. OPEN FORUM:

Evette Townsend, a resident who resides at 9140 Blackstone Dr., Providence Village, Texas Erora Sykes, a resident who resides at 10108 Cherry Hill Ln., Providence Village, TX 76227 regarding safety in Providence Village regarding section 8 and threats.

Alonzo Tutson, a resident who resides at 10300 Nantucket Dr., Providence Village, TX 76227 spoke and stated that he was proud of the job that the Town Council was doing:

Janell McClure, 1613 Barberry Hill Rd., Providence Village, TX asked if the ruling on the subsidized housing was the town's doing or the HOA. Mayor Inman responded that the HOA made the ruling and the Town did not have anything to do with it.

Mayor made it clear that the comments being made are in response to the actions taken by the HOA and not the Town Council and we have nothing to do with the ruling.

The Mayor went on to speak with the residents and asked the residents to stop being so ugly to each and that nothing will get accomplished with the level of hate being displayed. Be kind, lives are effected.

There were no additional requests to address the Town Council.

V. PRESENTATION

Introduction from Ryan Williams.

Denton County Commissioner, Ryan Williams, made a presentation regarding the activities going on in the community. The biggest issue is roads. He also noted that the County is not responsible for any actions of the Town Council or an HOA.

VI. COMMITTEE REPORTS/STAFF REPORTS:

a. Staff Reports

Brian Roberson provided a summary of the Town Hall activities.

Chief Kreidler gave a summary of law enforcement. Last week or so, questions have come to the Chief from council members regarding what the PD growth and

action over the the first half of the year. The patrols have doubled since last year. Citations are up by 66%, traffic stops are up by 25%. Arrested 49 people in Providence Village since the beginning of the year. Last year only 28 had been made in 2021, so the arrest are definitely up in volume. To answer the questions regarding how many of the arrests are residents versus non-residents and the answer is 33 were Providence Village residents and 16 were from other locations. Overtime costs are up. Generally there 2 officers assigned. Part 1 crimes (the big 7) there's been 30 since the first of the year. 27 theft and burglaries. Part 2 crimes are up by 10%. A total of 27 people have signed up to be block captains from the Neighborhood Watch program following the meeting on June 13th.

Chief Kreidler explained the requirements for the HOA to actually inform the officers that they want an unruly person removed from the pool area. They cannot do it on their own.

See something, say something. Last month we had the most calls. 244 in 2021 and 354 in 2022. Don't report to Facebook, report to the Aubrey PD. If you have information on a recent crime, call the non-emergency number. They cannot see it on social media.

Mayor Inman asked Chief Kreidler to share how Flock is working for the Aubrey PD.

Mayor Inman asked Chief Kreidler what the people who are scared for their safety because of their section 8 status, should do. Chief Kreidler made it clear that we don't know how someone gets their home and if they see something, they need to call the police department.

Brian Roberson provided a summary of the COVID statistics.

Mayor Pro-Tem Kelly Nelson thanked all of the people who applied and taking time for the interviews and there were great candidates. Mayor Pro-Tem Kelly Nelson nominated James Stewart; Council Member Stojan Bacev seconded. Council Members Jordan Woodard spoke that there were candidates who were more qualified. Mayor Pro-Tem Kelly Nelson noted that all of us started out with little or no experience. Motion carried: 5 in favor, Council Member Jordan Woodard opposed.

- c. Oath of Office for Council Member, Place 6 on the Town Council.

Town Secretary, Connie Sparks, administered the oath of office to James Stewart for Council Member Place 6.

- d. Consider, discuss and act upon Resolution for appointment of one member to the Board of Managers of the Denco Area 9-1-1 District.

Brian Roberson stated that there were two candidates.

Council Member Jordan Woodard nominated Jim Carter; Council Member Jeff Doramus seconded. Motion carried: 7 in favor, 0 opposed.

- e. Consider, discuss and act upon amendment to amended plat at the Enclave at Pecan Creek, Phase III.

Brian Roberson explained the administrative clerical error that was being corrected. Mayor Pro-Tem Kelly Nelson moved to accept the amendment to the amended plat; Council Member Victoria Mitchell seconded. Motion carried: 7 in favor, 0 opposed.

- f. Consider, discuss and act upon appointment of alternate members to the Zoning Board of Adjustments.
